## Programme Description

Safety and health in the workplace is of utmost importance. Occupational safety and health in industrial undertakings is achieved by employing a registered Safety Officer for workplace with 100 or more employees according to the Factories and Industrial Undertakings (Safety Officers and Safety Supervisors) Regulations.

The programme is designed to provide learners with professional knowledge and specific skills in occupational safety and health, and for those who intend to equip with a qualification as registered Safety Officers recognised by the Labour Department.

## Programme Outline

This programme consists of six modules:

1. Safety and Health Legislation
2. Fundamentals of Occupational Hygiene
3. Safety and Health Management
4. Audit and Accident Investigation
5. Risk Assessment, Inspection and Integrity
6. Engineering Safety

## Entry Requirements

1. Completion of a QF Level 3 programme, or equivalent, with one year's work experience or currently employed; or
2. Five HKCEE subjects at Grade E/Level 2 or above, including English and Chinese Languages, or equivalent, with two years' work experience; or
3. Mature applicants, i.e. those aged 21 or above, with at least 2 years' relevant work experience AND a pass in the entrance assessment

## External Recognition

This programme is recognised by the Labour Department as a scheduled qualification for Safety Officers in Hong Kong as stipulated in the Factories and Industrial Undertakings (Safety Officers and Safety Supervisors) Regulations.
